It is expected that by spring or early summer all classes will be back in session, with 400 plus students.


The beginning of the school year is also the time when Blessings of Joy-USA receives and reviews grant requests for Mweruka Junior School (MJS) and Blessings of Joy-Uganda. The grant requests are reviewed and adjusted based on anticipated available funds for 2021. Because of the generosity of so many, new teachers have been added to meet special learning and educational needs. Nutrition funding will increase to meet nutrition and health needs of an increasing number of children.

One of the goals of Blessings of Joy is for as many students as possible to be able to go on to high school after graduating from MJS. We are thankful for the many sponsors who are providing the opportunity for 24 MJS graduates to leave Mweruka to attend high school. Each of these students is provided tuition, room, board, and school supplies. Twelve of the 24 will be entering their first year of high school. Two sponsored graduates are attending trade school.

The number of MJS sponsored children has increased to 50. There are several other children who need and desire the love and support of a sponsor. 
## **Connecting - A World Apart**

## Uganda- School Opening! Benon's Report

In a letter from Benon sent to the BOJ Board on 2/9/21 we received the following information:

"I love and greet you in the name of the Lord. I want to tell you that (the) government has declared the reopening of other classes, but not all classes will resume at the same time. Primary six, high school senior three and technical students will be allowed to return on March 1st. The government said other classes of Primary 4 and 5 will follow in April, with the rest of classes to follow."

He also states in his letter that the government wants to resume where the students left off in 2020. The 2020 academic calendar will end in August and the 2021 calendar year will begin in September or October 2021.

## Featured Child: MATABALO ANDREW

Andrew was featured in our last newsletter. Andrew is still in need of sponsorship. Andrew is a young man who likes schooling so much. He is one of the most serious students and struggles daily to make the long walk from home to school, even if there is much rain. His home provision is lacking the support he needs to concentrate well in class. Andrew has potential to graduate from MJS, pass the National Exams and attend high school.

How would sponsorship help Andrew? Sponsorship would provide for Andrew's school tuition, a daily nutrition fortified school lunch, his school uniform, a pair of shoes with socks, and school supplies. Each month it would provide Andrew's family with a sack of cornmeal, powdered milk, blocks of soap, toothpaste, vaseline and shoe polish. It also would provide for any special needs such medical care, mosquito net, mattress, clothes, a special gift from sponsor at birthday or Christmas.

#### The gift of sponsorship is \$35 each month.

# Shoes for Children of MJS – With little, God can do much!

School is starting up in Uganda, the vulnerable children at Mwreuka Junior School will need new shoes. Just like all children, their feet grow fast and shoes wear out. Unlike our children and grandchildren, shoes are a luxury item and their feet are at risk of getting jiggers. The sand fleas dig and lay their eggs into bare feet and causing pain and sores. The Children at MJS have been blessed not to have a serious jigger outbreak since the Rotary Club of Tulsa provided the children shoes over 5 years ago. Through your generous giving Blessings of Joy has continued to provide shoes yearly, except for last year when schools were closed.

Shoes also protect the children's feet during their long walks to school, and during the rainy season. Shoes also make the children look "smart" in their uniform and give the children confidence. One pair of leather shoes costs \$17.00. The children's feet are measured by a local cobbler and he will make the shoes locally, helping to support the local economy.

This year Blessings of Joy's goal was to raise \$5,950. This will provide a pair of shoes and socks for each child in need. Through the generous giving of so many donors the matching grant was matched and exceeded. The goal for this year has been met. Thank you so much!
