UGANDA: The Current Situation with Covid-19

The number of cases of Covid 19 is increasing in the area, but many of those are people who remain asymptomatic, with no deaths reported.

As of June 2, 2020 (the original reopening date for the primary school), the government has pushed back the date for at least another month

There are currently more needs within the village of Mweruka as more parents of children attending/enrolled in school are seeking resources from BOJ. Food prices have increased in the village.

The government has recently eased some of the restrictions; allowing some travel by private car.

QUIK FACTS MWERUKA JUNIOR SCHOOL

- It is situated in the Masaka district in Mweruka, a remote village in Uganda.
- · Average daily attendance is around 400 children.
- It provides instruction to sponsored and nonsponsored children.
- The school is so remote, it does not have electricity or running water.
- · It has a hygiene program that instructs children in hand washing and brushing teeth.
- · It employs 15 teachers, an administrator, a cook and a guard.
- It has a daily school lunch program, supplementing nutritional needs of children.
