



Serving Community and Children

Since Covid first closed Mweruka Junior School 18 months ago the teachers and staff have done a remarkable job of serving the children of MJS and village families. We thank God for their service. The teachers and staff have:

- Taught groups of students (≤6) in the village during the first lockdown and school closure
- · Maintained the MJS campus
- · Upgraded the campus for reopening, according to government Covid mandated guidelines
- · Educated village families regarding covid guidelines
- Taught villagers how to make and use handwashing stations or "tip taps"
- Identified 76 village families needing nutritional support, purchased food and distributed it to the families.
- Established learning centers in the village where larger groups of students continue to be taught during current (second) lockdown and school closure

Latrine Collapses! Urgent financial help needed

In August of this year, the old and poorly constructed pit latrine collapsed. With the pit latrine no longer functional the number of latrine stalls available to the 400 students and 18 staff is four. Given the number of students, four stalls do not fulfill the rules and regulations of the Uganda Ministries of Education/Health. The MJS-proposed new latrine would provide six new stalls increasing the total number of stalls to 10, which would fulfill the rules and regulations. School does not resume until January 2022. This provides a two-month window of opportunity to build the latrine before school reopens. The cost of the new six stall latrine is \$4,442. Blessings of Joy is asking for donations to cover the cost of building the new latrine. Thank you in advance for your financial support!

COVID Lockdown

The strict Covid lockdown for the past 3-4 months is being lifted in some sectors.

Godfrey reports: "Things are getting back to normal. By January the Ugandan government is aiming to lift any kind of lockdown upon any sector. The government goal is to vaccinate everyone in the country who is above 18 years or older. Almost all of the staff members got vaccinated with first round. Now waiting for the second round. Covid has affected most of sectors under the lockdown. In the Mweruka region agricultural produce has encountered a low price and lack of market. Covid lockdown in our community has affected students with an increase in teenage pregnancies and children taken to Kampala to work particularly as house maids. Covid prolonged lockdowns have adversely affected the economic sector."

School Closure

Primary and secondary schools remain closed. It is anticipated the Government will allow them to reopen in January 2022. There was a partial reopening in spring and early summer 2021. Primary grades 4–7 had been attending school for about two months when the second strict lockdown and school closure was initiated in August 2021. Late January, early February is the traditional beginning of the academic year. The first lockdown and school closure began March of 2020. Because of school closures students have missed two years of primary education. Whatever grade a student was in when school closed March of 2020 will be the grade they will be in when primary and secondary schools opens in January 2022.

- Pray that financial aid will become available for MJS students who have graduated from high school and desire to enter technical training or university, so that they are able to bring the Light of Christ into Uganda as adults with a witness.

- The teachers, staff and children of Mweruka Junior School have stayed healthy and have not contracted COVID.
- The teachers have been able to receive the first round of vaccinations.

Benon Kizito (CHAIRMAN BOI-UGANDA)

In addition to being Chairman of Blessings of Joy – Uganda Board of Directors, Benon is responsible for the Sponsored Children Program, oversees the Blessings of Joy House (orphanage), leader of Blessings of Joy Gospel Outreach, helps direct the Blessings of Joy Church, which Solomon founded.

We are pleased to share Benon's response to our request.

"Thank you for giving me an opportunity to appear in newsletter! In brief, I am Benon Kizito, I am married with my wife Dorcus. We have 4 girls! In Blessings of Joy, I oversee the works of the organization, however, I am working mostly for sponsored children and I am glad that some children have already completed O Level (high school). I am happy to see children growing from younger age to



big men and women. I love them like my own children and I want them to go higher and be great people in our country! Challenges with sponsored children are that: It's not simple task to maintain them in school especially girls, after completion of primary level some begin to think to discontinue the studies. The other challenge is that some kids get family crisis or dangerous and unstable conditions and others lose their guardians. Then you have to find them a place to stay. That makes me to take them to stay at BOJ House. The BOJ house is about 23 kilometers from the school and that means they should be at BOJ house during break times. We have a problem of accommodating of such children at school since we have no boarding section at Mweruka Junior School.

I am also fully engaged in gospel missions and very grateful to people who are supporting the work of the Lord. As far as I can tell, the successes of the organization have come through this channel, believe it or not!

Also, Blessings has a church, I am happy that I am given a chance to minister most of the time I visit the church every month, however, I attend another church in Kampala and my Pastor is Julius Ewotu.

I must end now. Blessings to you and your families, Benon."

Fantastic! Primary Leaving Exam Results:

How about a high five for students and teachers. Through the above and beyond efforts of the students, teachers and staff the academic performance of the students has shown marked improvement. All graduating 7th grade students must take a national standardized exam, the Primary Leaving Exam (PLE). In 2017 no MJS student achieved the highest score, D-1 level, on the PLE exam. For the most recent PLE exam (2020), 49 percent of MJS graduates achieved the D-1 level and 50 percent achieved the D-2 level score. To attend high school a student must score at the D-3 level or better.

The BOJ Board is pleased with and proud of the students, teachers and staff at MJS. Through the generosity of so many Blessings of Joy partners the Sponsor a MJS teacher/Staff Drive now funds all of the 18 teacher/staff sponsorship positions.


Churches and Lockdown
