


Annual Meals for Children Fundraiser



What: Ugandan meal. You are invited to a Ugandan meal to give thanks for all the BOJ donors who make these meals for the children possible. There will be power point presentation on how the nutrition program is impacting the lives of the children at Mweruka Junior School, Mweruka, Uganda. We hope to continue funding daily meals for the children with your generous contributions.

What do funds provide? Mweruka Junior School is in an area of Uganda where malnutrition is endemic. For the past six years Blessings of Joy has provided school lunches for the 400 children attending MJS. The result: elimination of malnutrition, improved children's health and improved attendance at school. The cost is roughly 15 cent per child per meal or \$3.00 per child per month. The annual cost for 400 children is \$12,500. We hope you will be able to come to the Ugandan meal, November 13th.

Brian is one of the brightest students in grade one. Though he and his family live very far away from the school, he is ever present and active in class. Brian's heart full of studying and eager to learn. But his parents struggle financially to keep him in school. Therefore, Brian and his family are seeking sponsorship, which will enable him to fully concentrate and achieve a greater success out of his studies.

How would sponsorship help Brian? Sponsorship would provide for Brian's school tuition, a daily nutrition fortified school lunch, his school uniform, a pair of shoes with socks, and school supplies. Each month it would provide Brian's family with a sack of cornmeal, powdered milk, blocks of soap, toothpaste, vaseline and shoe polish. It also would provide for any special needs such as medical care, mosquito net, mattress, clothes, a special gift from sponsor at birthday and Christmas.

Joan - Accepted to Nursing School!

In 2017, Joan started high school at St. Charles Lwayga S.S. Kasasa, Uganda. But during Joan's Senior year at St. Charles Lwayga SS, the COVID 19 virus had become a world-wide pandemic. It was with high hopes and God's grace that St. Charles Lwayga SS reopened in October of 2020. Joan completed her secondary schooling and graduated in March of 2021. The Final National Exam was taken and Joan scored well in Division 1. Joan made application to nursing school during the Summer of 2021. It was so exciting when she learned of her acceptance and began training at Kyetume School of Nursing and Midwifery in January of 2022.

Her program will last 5 semesters (2.5 years). The per semester cost varies with different certificate programs. The cost of the nursing certificate program is \$920 per semester, which includes tuition, uniform, boarding, and school supplies. God's hand is upon Joan and the financial support she needs to complete her studies in mid 2024 will be available.

Joan has grown up and looks so proud to be wearing her nurse's uniform. In a recent letter to her sponsors, she wrote: "I am now in second semester and I am grateful that as per now I am able to conduct delivery and I dedicate the new life to God so that He may help him/her to serve Him and to provide them with peace and strength." (Psalms 29:11)

Also, Joan is active in the Blessings of Joy Church. Benon shared this picture of Joan getting ready to preach in a youth service at the church.

I am always appreciating your support because you have changed my life positively. May The Almighty God keep on blessing your lives forever and ever in Jesus' name I have prayed.



Shoes For Needy Feet

Most of the children's homes (huts) have dirt floors. Jiggers (endemic, burowing sand flea infection of the feet) can be prevented by wearing shoes, which many children at Mweruka Junior school do not have. Leather shoes made by a local cobbler are purchased by BOJ-Uganda. The photo shows the first 70 children this year to receive a pair of shoes and socks. The next group of children needing shoes will have an outline of their foot made on paper which will be given to the cobbler. From this outline he will make the shoes in his shop. It is estimated that 300 children attending MJS will need shoes this school year. The children are blessed by the love and generous giving of so many Blessings of Joy donors.







Sponsored Students: Africa with Love High School

Options are limited for graduates of Mweruka Junior School who want to continue on to high school. There are private secondary schools several miles from their home village of Mweruka. To attend one of these schools the cost of tuition, room, board, and school supplies is beyond what most families can afford. The 20 MJS graduates pictured here attend Africa with Love High School because of the love and generosity of Blessings of Joy donors. The 8 students on the far right of the picture, dressed in light blue tops and dark blue bottoms, received scholarships from Blessings of Joy. Each year the MJS faculty selects two students from the graduating class to be awarded a high school, four or six year scholarship. Selection is based on financial need and academic standing.

The remaining students in the photo have continued being sponsored after graduation. (Commitment to sponsorship is not an expectation past the completion of primary school with Blessings of Joy.) Three of these students live at the Blessings of Joy House/Orphanage. Africa with Love High School was selected by Benon, Uganda BOJ director, because it is an academically sound Christian school.

This is the hope and future playing out in real time to youth, who without Blessings of Joy and MJS might not have the chance to make their dreams come true.
